


What word would you use to describe David in Book One o	f the Psalms (Psalms 3-41)? Why?

FLOW OF BOOK ONE

- Humanity were made to rule with God (Psalm 8)
- David's line is the one that the King will come from (Psalm 16)
- Yet, God's 'door policy' is that only one with clean hands and a pure heart can dwell with Him (Psalm 15, 24)
- And none of humanity are good enough (Psalm 14)
- · And that includes David...





- But God's promise (of Psalms 1 & 2) is sure (Psalm 19)
- And He will bring His people to His house/mountain forever (Psalm 23)

FOCUSSING ON THE MESSIAH

- David is a type ("the type of thing God does").
 - For example, a righteous sufferer.
- Abel -> Joseph -> Moses -> David -> Suffering Servant -> Jesus.
